CLIFFORD HAWORTH READ THE MINUTES OF THE QUARTERLY MEETING HELD AT ST. LOUIS. THEY WERE APPROVED AS READ.

A LETTER FROM PAXTON HART REQUESTING AID IN THE FORM OF A VALENTINE PLAN FOR AMERICAN INDIANS WAS READ, FOLLOWED BY DISCUSSION. ROBERT BYRD REPORTED THAT FRIENDS ACTIVITIES AMONG INDIANS MAY HAVE TO BE LAID DOWN UNLESS A GENEROUS RESPONSE TO A CALL FOR FUNDS OCCURS.

CLIFFORD HAWORTH REPORTED ON THE CUBA FRIENDS MEETING IN ORIENTE PROVINCE. MEMBERS THERE HAVE FOLLOWED THE HISTORIC FRIENDS PEACE TESTIMONY TO A VERY HIGH DEGREE, AND HAVE FOUND THEMSELVES IN A DIFFICULT POSITION. ATTENDANCE AT FRIENDS SCHOOLS HAS DROPPED CONSIDERABLY.

ROBERT BYRD SUGGESTED THAT COMMITTEE REPORTS FOR YEARLY MEETING BE PREPARED AND PRESENTED AT THE MAY QUARTERLY MEETINGS. THIS WAS APPROVED.

HELEN PRICE SUGGESTED THAT A LETTER FROM THE QUARTERLY MEETING BE DRAFTED BY THE TWO CLERKS AND SENT TO THE SENATORS FROM THIS AREA. THE LETTER IS TO EXPRESS OUR THOUGHT THAT THE PRESENT SELECTIVE SERVICE LAWS SHOULD NOT BE EXTENDED.

ROBERT BYRD, CLIFFORD HAWORTH AND OTHERS PRESENTED INFORMATION ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF A BUILDING AT McNABB TO HOUSE YEARLY MEETING. PRESENT INFORMATION INDICATES \$10 - 15,000 WILL BE NEEDED. THERE WAS GENERAL, BUT NOT UNANIMOUS APPROVAL. IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT ROBERT BYRD PREPARE A LETTER WHICH WOULD PRESENT MORE DETAILS AND THE WRITTEN REPLIES OF THE MONTHLY MEETINGS.

THE MAY QUARTERLY MEETING WILL BE HELD AT CLEAR CREEK ON MAY 9 1959.

THE MEETING CLOSED WITH A MOMENT OF PRAYER.

AT THE SAME TIME AS THE ABOVE MEETING WAS HELD, THE JUNIOR QUARTERLY MEETING WAS IN SESSION. ADULT LEADERS WERE: A.M. REBER, JUNE COBIN, MARGARET MEYER, NORMA PRICE AND DOTY WEEKS. THERE WERE 34 PRESENT IN THIS MEETING.

THERE WERE 34 IN THE EVENING SESSION AT WHICH FRAN WEEKS AND RACHEL WELLER DISCUSSED LITERATURE THAT PERTAINS TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF SPIRITUAL LIFE.
