

Blue River Quarterly

Blue River Quarterly is composed of Friends Meetings and Worship Groups from downstate Illinois and eastern Missouri, including Bloomington-Normal, Clear Creek near McNabb, Columbia, Decatur, Rolla, Saint Louis, Southern Illinois in Carbondale, Spoon River in Monmouth, Springfield, and Urbana-Champaign. All Meetings are a part of Illinois Yearly Meeting. A website (www.blueriverquarterly.org) provides information on the history of the Quarterly Meeting, calendar of upcoming sessions and Minutes from previous sessions.

Our Meetings. Blue River Quarterly gathers twice a year, in the fall and spring, for spiritual nourishment, business, and to help plan Yearly Meeting sessions. Newcomers of all ages are welcome! Children attend Blue River Quarterly without charge, and there is a children's program concurrent with the adult sessions to allow parents to attend meetings. There are also inter-generational activities, and opportunities for recreation and fellowship.

DuBois Facilities

DuBois Center resides on 300 acres of woods with two lakes, boating, swimming, fishing, hiking, a labyrinth and a playground. Meals and the adult program are offered in Oak Lodge; sleeping, fellowship, and the children's programs are offered in Hickory Lodge. There is also a dormitory-style cottage, as well as camping at tent sites or in rustic cabins at Deer Run, which has a bath house. Linens are provided at Hickory and the cottage. In Hickory and the cottage we have 13 rooms with a total of 26 beds (some doubles) with 37 positions, ten lower bunks, and ten upper bunks. Bathrooms accommodate multiple users.

Rooms are shared; there are no single rooms unless attendance is light. Please register early and indicate any needs you have when sharing spaces.

What Should I Bring?

Possible items: Friday supper, swim suits, outdoor clothing, insect repellent, sunscreen, flashlight, notebook, musical instruments and songbooks, snacks to share, games, toys and recreational equipment.

Children's Program

Dawn Amos, Mark Amos, Maurine Pyle, and David Finke will lead the children's program, and there may be a babysitter for the very young. The children's program will operate Saturday morning, late Saturday afternoon, Saturday evening and Sunday morning.

The theme will correspond to the adult program, including Bible stories, discussion, and skits related to healing, forgiveness, compassion and witness.

Please register as soon as possible if your children will attend, so that the age groups and final age-appropriate program can be discerned.

High School Friends are asked to participate in the workshop, and are invited to business sessions as they feel led.

Assistance. We want parents to be able to participate in the adult program, so grown-ups are invited to assist in the kids' program for an hour during the weekend.

Food and Lodging Costs

Adults. The adult package cost for two nights' lodging and five meals is \$105. For those unable to stay the weekend, lodging is \$40 for a night and meals are \$10 each. Please contact the Registrar if you are interested in using Deer Run camping and cabins at a lower fee.

Children. Blue River Quarterly absorbs the costs for children 18 and under; please consider contributing a little extra to help cover those costs.

Registration

Fees are suggested in order to cover costs, but no one should hesitate to attend due to financial reasons. Please pay the amount you can afford, and join us. Monthly meetings may also provide financial assistance for attending. Pre-payment is preferred; make checks payable to **Blue River Quarterly**.
