Whereas, the Society of Friends is the owner of a Meeting House adjacent to the cemetery, it is the proposal of the Friends Cemetery Ass'n to take over maintain and keep in good repair the Meeting House at this location, which may be used for all purposes suitable to a house of this nature for the benefit of the community – Title of the property to remain in the Society of Friends.

This proposal is for assuring suitable accommodations for funerals, community gathering, etc for the residents of the immediate neighborhood.
