Com. with us, who was guest speaker also Foster & Margaretta Heacock, who always add so much to our gatherings, interesting reports was given from study circles and particularly the Teachers Training Class at Clear Creek conducted by Foster Heacock. Reports of social work brought out an interesting discussion of Am. Fr. Ser. Com. work. Murray Kenworthy said no other Christian Organization had equaled the work of the Com. during the world war.

Murray Kenworthy made a report of the proposed All Friends Conference to be held some time in June at Earlham College, Clarence Pickett who is now abroad will be present an interesting report of his findings on Peace at that time.

Foster Heacock reported attending a meeting of a group of young Friends at State College, Urbana, Ill. – a group of students who meet each first day in the McKinley Foundation Chapel at the College and asked that a letter of encouragement go out from this Meeting to them.

Thos. A. Jenkins suggested that a telegram be sent to President Hoover urging his continued support of reduction of armament.

A recommendation from Clear Creek Monthly Meeting that the accrued interest resulting from the Relief Fund of \$50. be given to Am. Fr. Ser. Committee.

The 12th Quiry was read and some discussion followed.

At 4 p.m. Murray Kenworthy gave an address on “American Citizenship” as presented in the Schwimmer, Webb and McIntosh cases, followed by an Open Forum. After dinner in Hull House Refectory the gathering listened to a student debate “Should Nations adopt a plan of complete disarmament, excepting such forces as may be needed for Police purposes.” This was arranged by Prof Cornelius Cunningham of Northwestern University, between teams of Lincoln Memorial Univ. of Tenn. & N.W. Univ. of Ill. the debate was listened to with much interest & was very gratifying to see young men concerning themselves with this vital question.
