1<sup>st</sup> ans. All our meetings for worship and discipline have been attended (except one at Clear Creek on account of sickness and inclement weather) though often small unbecoming behaviour mostly avoided, the hour nearly observed

2<sup>d</sup> ans. Love and unity appear to be maintained by most friends, talebearing & detraction discouraged by some; no apparent differences

9<sup>th</sup> ans. Care is taken to deal with offenders nearly as queries. By the reports from Clear Creek mo. meeting we are informed that the indulged meeting in Tazewell County is continued under the care of a committee, also an indulged meeting for worship on first day granted to friends in Whiteside county Illinois under the care of a committee which is satisfactory to this meeting.
