

Blue River Quarterly Meeting of Friends held at Hull House on Halstead St. Chicago 2nd mo. 21st 1925.

The clerk not being present Clarence Mills is appointed for the day.

Reports received and read from Chicago and Clear Creek monthly meetings show that Marie Poulson, Thomas A. Jenkins, Clement B. Flitcraft, Marie Fredrickson, Isaac P. Wierman, Josiah Tomlinson, Lulu Mills, Edna W. Wolf and Clarence C. Mills were appointed as representatives to this meeting. Six of these are present. Warner Coal is present representing Benjaminville. No report from Blue River or Benjaminville.

Reading of the minutes of the Eleventh Month quarter called the report of the committee appointed to audit the books of the treasurer and bring forward nominations for officers for the coming year. A written report is presented which after consideration is approved. Accordingly Clarence Mills is appointed clerk

Recommendation is made that the apportionment of Yearly Meeting Friends be changed as follows,–

Benjaminville — 16%

Chicago — 18%

Blue River — 16%

Clear Creek — 50%

The committee's recommendation of this change is approved so far as representation at this meeting are concerned. The final approval of this assessment list is referred to the quarterly meeting in 5th mo. next.

The committee finds the treasurer's books correct and we approve their nomination of Clement B. Flitcraft for Clerk.

This same committee further recommends that the officers appointed at this time hold over until the Eighth month quarter held at Benjaminville in 1926. The committee to make nominations to be appointed and to meet in Fifth month at Blue River. This meeting after discussion is also approved for trial. The treasurer is to report in 5th mo. 1926

A request coming from Intelligencer that this meeting be reported to them for publication under "Friendly news notes." Thomas A. Jenkins is requested to forward a report in accordance with this request. Discussion brought out the need that each monthly

meeting or interested Friends in Friendly neighborhoods or travelling Friends should send in reports of their doings and observations.

In a letter from J. Barnard Walton we learn that arrangements have been made for holding the quarterly meetings of Whitewater and Miami on consecutive week ends with our at Blue River in Fifth month next again as last year. The exact date is not announced as yet.

A letter from Wilbur K. Thomas Executive Secretary of the American Friends Service Committee asks for contributions and help toward the work planned for relief in France, Germany, Poland, Russia, Mexico and the United States. Clement B. Flitcraft, chairman of the Yearly Meeting's committee to receive contributions for American Friends Service Committee offers the suggestion that each of our members contribute at least one dollar toward this good work.

Announcement was made at this time that a meeting had been arranged for this Seventh day night to be addressed by Jane Addams on "The Child Labor Amendment."

Having transacted the business in good life and spirit we conclude to meet at Highland Meeting House near Salem Indiana in Fifth month next.
